Happy Valley Bowling Club has recently entered into a Loan Introducer program with our own BankSA. BankSA are also a sponsor of our Club.

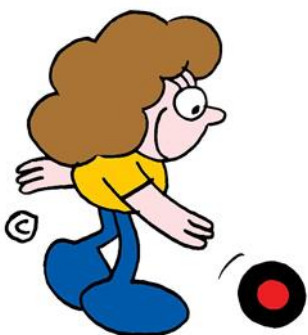

UMPIRES CORNER

Q1 – What action should be taken if a jack in the ditch is moved by a toucher?

A – The movement of the jack is valid and remains in its new position.

Q2 – The jack was centred on the wrong line and not noticed until the second is about to bowl. This player challenges and says it should be moved to the centre line. Is the player correct?

A – No! The jack position cannot be challenged after a bowl has been delivered.

Q3.1 – Team A commenced the end and played their first bowl. It was then noted that it was their opponent who won the previous end. What should happen?

A – Only one bowl had been played so the end must be restarted by Team B.

Q3.2 – In the above situation, what happens if a bowl has been played by each team?

A – The end continues.
